Curriculum Map: Summer 2



What are we learning this term?

English THE THE AND TABLET THE THE WOOD WOOD	We will be writing 'warning tales' with an emphasis on description, before moving on to poetry at the end of the half term. Our class book is 'The Enchanted Wood' by Enid Blyton but we may have time to squeeze in another book before the end of the year too as the children are excited about the release of Agents of the Wild 3 this month!
Maths	We will be recapping arithmetic and finding fractions of numbers , before moving on to our last topics of the year involving measure - particularly mass and weight , and volume and capacity . Our 'Big Maths' will focus on key number and place value skills, as well as problem solving with questions in different contexts.
Science	Our topic for the whole summer term is 'Plants', and this half term we are moving on to investigating what plants need to grow (and how this can differ between plant species), as well as seed dispersal and pollination.
Geography	Our topic is 'Making Maps', where we will be improving our map skills. This will include interpreting different types of maps, as well as making our own maps of the local area! We will use map symbols, a key, and introduce scale / grid references.
Art	We will be creating paintings, drawings, fabric design and 3D art inspired by our focus artist, Yayoi Kusama .
PE	We will be outside improving our Ball Skills and practising Athletics activities.
RE	This half term, we are exploring Judaism through the question "Why is the Torah such a joy for the Jewish community?"
PSHE	We will be discussing changes throughout our lifetimes, including transition to a new class and new key stage.
Music	We will reflect on all the songs and genres covered in music this year, improving our singing, recorder and glockenspiel skills.
Computing	We will be using the Chromebooks to present ideas effectively, and put our safe researching skills into practise.
