#### Message from Mrs Barrow

We are pleased to say that tutoring will re-commence for some children this term and will help us to boost the confidence of pupils who need this.

<u>Covid-19 Guidance – Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November</u> Just to remind you about updated guidance from Suffolk County Council (SCC) regarding Covid-19.

As case numbers are currently high in Suffolk, these actions are intended to break the chain of transmission and protect education settings from outbreaks. SCC have stated the following:

- Suffolk's children and young people aged between 4 and 18 years are now advised to stay at home when a sibling they live with, who attends an education setting with an outbreak, tests positive for COVID-19.
- All siblings who live in the same house as the positive case should get a **PCR test from the third day** following the initial positive PCR. If this comes back as **negative** and the siblings feel well, those siblings can **return to their education setting**.
- If any sibling develops symptoms, they should isolate immediately and take another PCR test.
- If any sibling tests positive, they should isolate immediately.

SCC Public Health is also advising that:

- Staff in education settings to wear face coverings in communal areas outside of the classroom, unless exempt for medical reasons
- Any visitors to wear a face covering while on-site, this includes **adults collecting children in the playground.**

Therefore, we are reintroducing the need for face coverings to be worn in the playground when dropping off and collecting your child, unless you are exempt for medical reasons, from **Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November**. I would like to reassure you that we will still be handwashing regularly, have ventilated rooms and have an extra awareness of hygiene in school in an attempt to prevent illnesses spreading. We also ask that you continue to monitor your child/ ren for any illnesses and symptoms of Covid-19. Please do contact the school office if you are concerned about your child so that we can advise you of the next steps to take.
