All children have the opportunity to select a book from our class bookshelf to develop their interest in books and a love of reading. This term we will continue to have a book of the week and hope to visit the local library. | This half term, your child will need to complete a maths mat or a comprehension task and return this to school each week. There is a tray for these to be put in in the classroom and spares will be available in the tray if homework is lost. Please continue to indicate on the sheet any questions that your child has found more challenging. I can then later address these in class and plug gaps. The children are all aware that If homework is not handed in on a Friday then they will have until Monday to hand it in. If it is not handed in then, they will need to complete it during their playtime. Please also keep your child ticking over on Times Tables Rockstars. Areas of learning for Spring 1

English-Warning tale and Instructions

We will be looking at the Structure of a Quest Tale alongside our class book, The Firework Maker's Daughter this half term.

- Discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar.
- Composing and rehearsing sentences orally (including dialogue), progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and an increasing range of sentence structures.
- To use adverbial phrases and vocabulary to add detail.
- To introduce paragraphs as a way to group material.

Maths-Multiplication and division, Money and Statistics

Recall multiplication and division facts for the 3x, 4x and 8x tables with increasing speed and accuracy. • Use multiplication and division facts from the 3x, 4x and 8x tables to solve word problems with more than one step. • Identify patterns in known multiplication tables. • Multiply multiples of 10 (including three-digit numbers) mentally using known facts. • Use the grid method to solve multiplication problems which go beyond known facts. • Use number lines to solve division problems beyond known facts with increasing accuracy and speed. • Begin to use the bus stop method as a written method for division. • Solve missing number problems which go beyond known facts. • Solve scaling problems with increasing accuracy, beginning to work out the scale used from the measurements. • Spotting patterns when solving correspondence problems and beginning to predict the number of possibilities.

<u>Science-Light</u>

Understand that dark is the absence of light. • Set up an investigation and make predictions. • Understand how surfaces reflect light. • Recognise that a mirror appears to reverse an image. • Identify some parts of the eye. • Understand how the Sun can damage parts of the eye. • Identify opaque, translucent and transparent objects. • Know how shadows change size.
